Delhi Rotary

This Halloween, our club continued the tradition of a candy slide on the busiest street in the village, with an added twist: we gave away 50 spooky books to the first trick-or-treaters. This book giveaway was a hit with kids and parents alike, with some parents reporting that kids were so excited that they went to sleep clutching their book. This effort was an extension of our Summer Reading initiative and we plan to continue it next year.

On November 8, we heard from Dan Gashler of Delaware County Citizens for Refugee Support (DCCRS). This group has been raising funds to free two Russian dissidents from a detention camp in Louisiana. Boris and Maria are both medical doctors and active supporters of Alexei Navalny's opposition to Vladimir Putin's regime. They fled Russia and legally sought asylum in the US, ending up in a detention center with limited drinking water and in overcrowded and unsafe conditions.

Thanks to the DCCRS, Boris and Maria have been released on bond and are now living in Delaware County. They need help with medical attention, legal assistance, and financial support until they are able to secure work permits. DCCRS also seeks volunteers to help with food, transportation, supplies, translation, and neighborly support.

Dan approached the Delhi Rotary Club seeking our help in networking and getting the word out about Boris and Maria. There are other dissidents still in detention and the DCCRS program may expand. If you or your club has any resources to offer, please email DCCRS: delcors@gmail.com.
